An application form for the Inc. Soc. can be downloaded and completed, then either scanned and emailed to us or posted.


For those that are unable to get to the shop but want to participate, there will be a link sent out to those who request it (email us) for video conferencing.

## New Non-fiction Books in the shop –




### The Lie That Settles by Peter Farrell

### The Gift of Life by Anetta Cupido





### Never Judge a Book by Stacey Broadbent

### Changels Genesis: Initiation (Part One) by Peter King



